#3 NATIONAL DEFENSE AUTHORIZATION ACT PASSES SENATE

The Senate passed their version the National Defense of Authorization Act (NDAA) by a vote of 77-20. The legislation would authorize \$924.7 billion in spending for national security programs. The House passed their of the NDAA version September 10th by a vote of 231-196. The House and Senate will not reconcile differences and pass a final conference report before the December 31st deadline.
